These are the words that can often make you sound like you're not much of a musician. This is mostly because you're trying to use a non-musical term to describe what you hear in the music.

Your choice of words in these situations is important and it helps to have a big library of words to draw from.

When you hear a new tone colour word that you think might work well as a descriptive word for a piece of music, check that it's ok with your teacher and then write it down. Describe why or when you would use it and if you can, give an example.
